Recycling and Sustainable Ideas for Your office

- Provide recycling bins in each of your offices. If your building does not offer recycling, get a few tenants together and brainstorm ideas for starting a recycling program.
- Find out if your building provides compositing services and purchase a composting bin. Read more about composting in this edition of our e-newsletter.
- Purchase biodegradable utensils, plates and cups. If you're in a small office, think about switching to reusable utensils, plates and cups where possible.
- Ask your vendors not to provide plastic plates or utensils and ask them not to wrap food in plastic.
- Reduce paper; stop printing emails, avoid paper subscriptions, use double-sided printing.

Tips for a sustainable garden:

- Set a timer and rain delay option to water your lawn/plants.
- Plant succulents and/or plants native to your region.
- · Eliminate chemicals.
- Don't till instead use wood by-products such as sawdust and bark mulch, rotted manure, grass or wheat straw and compost.

Traditional sunscreen contains two key ingredients, oxybenzone and octinoxate, which are both harmful to the environment. After applying sunscreen, whenever we take a dip in a lake or ocean or take a shower to cool off, these chemicals make their way into our waterways. Studies suggest they are not filtered by water treatment plants and

severely impact the marine ecosystems where they end up. The concern is their link to coral reef bleaching.
